RESPONSIBILITY OF MANAGEMENT CORPORATIONS TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH SAFE MANAGEMENT MEASURES

We refer to our <u>circular</u> dated 22 May 2021 on the responsibility of management corporations ("MCSTs") to put in place measures to ensure that residents comply with the prevailing safe management measures ("SMMs").

- The framework under the Building Maintenance and Strata Management Act ("BMSMA") allows MCSTs to self-regulate the management and maintenance of their estates. Under this framework, the MCST has the duty to manage, control and administer the common property for the benefit of all subsidiary proprietors ("SPs") in the development.
- 3 Under the COVID-19 (Temporary Measures) Act 2020 ("COTMA") and regulations, MCSTs must, amongst others, take steps to regularly assess and identify the risks of COVID-19 transmission that may arise in relation to all activities carried out in the development. MCSTs must also establish and apply appropriate internal policies, procedures and controls to mitigate such risks from the activities especially if the activity is assessed to have higher risk of potential COVID-19 transmission.
- 4 MCSTs are advised to implement the following measures (not exhaustive) so as to discharge their duty in taking steps to establish controls to mitigate the risk of transmission of COVID-19 and ensuring that residents comply with SMMs within their estates:
 - (a) display signage and BCA's updated <u>circulars</u> clearly on SMMs on notice boards or in common areas/facilities;
 - (b) deploy security officers/staff to attend to feedback on breach of SMM, including dispersing crowds, if necessary;
 - (c) issue a formal reminder to specific residents who are observed to be non-compliant with SMM. An example of how a reminder could be drafted is included in Annex A;



- (d) report breach of SMM to BCA after MCST's issuance of reminders;
- (e) implement additional measures to ensure SMM compliance e.g. maintaining records of visitors in visitor logbook, etc.
- All MCSTs, together with residents, have a collective responsibility, to ensure that the community is safe. Therefore, it is important for MCSTs to establish controls and implement necessary measures that help in performing their duty in mitigating the risk of COVID-19 transmission. Should there be any contraventions of COVID-19 laws, appropriate enforcement action will be taken against MCSTs and/or residents as may be appropriate.
